Media Release for the week of July 25 – Aug 1 2016

July 31/16- Police members responded to a report of a domestic disturbance at a residence in the east side of the City. Police were able to mediate the situation and escorted an intoxicated male to a family member's house to stay until sober. No charges were laid.

July 31/16- In the early morning hours, Police responded to a report of an injured male on the street in a residential neighborhood, Police responded and found that a 19 year old male was unconscious due to a fall from a skateboard. He was transported by EMS to Regina but sadly later passed away from a severe head injury. The incident is still under investigation.

Police responded to numerous noise complaints throughout the week, Police want to remind residents to be mindful of their noise and respectful of your neighbors. First offence is \$250.00 fine which will increase greatly if noise persists after first offence.

July 29/16- Police received a complaint of a family dispute which left an adult male with no place to stay and asking Police for assistance. Police were able to mediate the situation and assisted in locating a ride to a family member's home in Regina.

July 28/16- Police received a complaint of vandalism done to a side window of a parked vehicle. It appears the window was damaged by some type of glass breaking tool. The investigation is ongoing.

July 28/16- Police responded to an accident at the corner of 3rd St. and 7th Ave, the vehicle travelling on 7th Ave failed to yield and struck the vehicle driving on 3rd St. No injuries were reported and one vehicle had to be towed from the scene. The driver of the one vehicle was charged with fail to yield.

On July 27/16 Police were called to a residence in Weyburn for a domestic disturbance. Police arrested a Young offender for assault, and the subsequent investigation determined the young offender had breached their earlier release conditions; he will appear in court later this month facing assault and breach of condition charges.

July 27/16- Police received a complaint of someone breaking into the Junior High School. Police responded and arrested two males who were caught running out of the school. There was damage done to the doors and both males, in their 20's, were charged with Mischief and released for a later court date.

July 26/16- Police, as well as EMS, responded to a motor vehicle accident at the intersection of 1st Ave and 5th St. The vehicle travelling south on 5th St failed to stop at a red light and the vehicle travelling east on 1st Ave. struck the other vehicle in the intersection. There was extensive damage to both vehicles. All people involved were checked out at the scene by EMS but no one was transported to hospital. Both vehicles were towed from scene and the one driver charged with fail to stop for red light.

July 26/16- Police responded to a complaint of a break and enter to a residence in the south end of the city. Money and alcohol is reported as being stolen. The matter is still under investigation

July 25/16- Police responded to a report of a domestic dispute, upon arrival Police were able to calm the situation down and assisted as a female left the residence. The matter remains under investigation.
