December 29th

At about 7:45 pm a 17 year old female was travelling on McGillivray Drive when an animal ran into the street. As a result the driver took evasive action causing her to lose control and strike a tree.

December 30th

The Weyburn PS were called to a report of a domestic assault between a 60 year old male and a 56 year old female. The male was transported to the local hospital. The matter is still under investigation.

December 31st

At about 1:45 am the Weyburn PS received a report about a vehicle that had been parked in the Coteau Avenue/Montgomery Cres area that had been egged. Anyone who has any information about this incident is asked to contact the Weyburn PS, or to call Crime Stoppers.

The Weyburn PS are investigating a report of a Hit & Run vehicle collision that happened in the Wal-Mart parking lot between 5:30 and 6:00 pm. This incident involved more than the typical bumper bump often encountered. In this case the driver's door handle of the victim vehicle was ripped off. Anyone having information about this incident is asked to contact either the Weyburn PS, or to call Crime Stoppers.

January 1st

As a result of a traffic stop an 18 year old male was charged with driving while suspended. He was charged and the vehicle impounded.
