Weyburn Police Service Media Release November 1, 2015 to November 8, 2015

On November 2nd, the Weyburn Police Service received a report of a hit and run after the complainant's vehicle had been struck while parked in a parking lot. A suspect vehicle was identified and the incident remains under investigation.

On November 2nd, a complaint was received by the Weyburn Police Service about a mischief that had occurred on Halloween evening. The complainant advised police their truck had been egged and paint balled on Halloween though they had not reported it at the time. It was reported after the complainant cleaned the vehicle and noticing the truck had been damaged by the paint balls. No suspects were identified in this incident.

On November 2nd, the Weyburn Police Service received a RID (Report Impaired Drivers) tip of a possible impaired driver. Members on patrol located the suspect vehicle a short time later and the driver was arrested. The subsequent investigation resulted in the 25 year old male driver being charged with impaired drive and driving while over .08. He was later released from custody and will appear later in court.

On November 3rd, the Weyburn Police Service responded to a two vehicle accident at Highway 39 and Government Road. The investigation determined a North bound truck had failed to stop at the red light striking the vehicle on Highway 39. No injuries were reported and the driver of the North bound vehicle, a 50 year old male, was charged with disobeying a red light.

On November 6th, Weyburn Police Service received a complaint of a stolen truck. The truck, a 1998 White Ford F 150, had been stolen from the driveway of a residence in South Weyburn. Later during the day, Police located the stolen truck and it was determined a number of tools had been stolen from the back of the truck. The complainant also advised police that two other vehicles which were parked in the driveway had also been entered and a gas can and some keys were stolen. The incident remains under investigation.

On November 6th, police received a report of an individual who had been bitten by a dog running loose. The individual went to the hospital and was treated and released for a minor bite injury. The owner of the dog, a 55 year old female, was charged under the Weyburn Bylaw and will appear in court later this month.

On November 8th, while on patrol members of the Weyburn Police Service observed a disturbance at a local nightclub. Police separated those involved, and determined a mischief had also occurred. A 29 year old male had damaged the vehicle of one of the individuals involved in the disturbance. During the arrest of this individual he resisted and was later

charged with mischief and resist arrest. He was released when sober and will appear in court date later this month.
