The Weyburn Police Service would like to remind all new drivers of the legal requirements. Unless you have a valid Class 5 driver's licence you are required to drive with someone who is qualified to be a supervising driver. What this means is that if you have a Class 7 licence you cannot drive alone.

The Weyburn PS would also like to remind the driver's that there is a legal requirement to STOP when directed to do so by a School Patrol Crossing Guard. These very dedicated school children provide a very valuable service to ensure the safety of all users of the road. When they are displaying the STOP paddle all drivers are legally obligated to stop. A driver found in violation of that law can face a substantial fine.

November 11th

As a result of a traffic stop an 18 year old male was found to be in violation of numerous provisions of the Traffic Safety Act. He was charged with driving an unregistered vehicle and also charged with driving while disqualified. The vehicle was impounded.

The Weyburn PS received a call regarding damage that had been done to a residence and vehicle. Upon investigation it was learned that owing to a complicated personal situation tempers from a number of individuals got the better of them A 25 year old male and a 16 year old female were arrested and charges are pending.

November 13th

The Weyburn PS received a report of a hit & run collision to a vehicle parked in the 300 Block of 5th Street. It appears that a vehicle sideswiped a parked vehicle damaging the parked vehicle's mirror.
