Media Release for the week of April 18-24 2016

April 17th

The Weyburn Police Service over the past months had received a number of complaints of ATV's riding on City property near the NE part of the City. Of concern was the safety of those pedestrians using the walking path or surrounding area. On April 17th, two adult drivers of ATV's were stopped and subsequently charged under the Weyburn Bylaw. Owners of ATV's are reminded that it is unlawful to ride these recreational vehicles anywhere in City limits.

April 18th

Members of the Weyburn Police Service received a report of a male who was threatening self harm. After an extensive search Police located the male and was arrested under the Mental Health Act and transported to the hospital for treatment.

April 19th

Police responded to a local business for a report of a theft. Police were able to locate the suspect vehicle a short time later. As a result of the investigation a male found in the vehicle was charged with theft under, breach of his conditions from a previous charge and Obstruct Police officer. He was remanded in custody for court the following day.

April 21st

Police responded to a domestic dispute, upon arrival police assisted in mediating the situation and helping one of the parties vacate the residence. No charges were laid in regard to the incident.

Police would like to remind all residence that the path behind Heritage village has been barricaded by rocks and no vehicles are allowed in that area. We would like to ask the public to not move the rocks to gain access with their vehicles.

April 22nd

Police responded to a reported mischief at a residence on the south side of Weyburn. The complainant's vehicle which had been parked at the residence was found to have 3 tires slashed. The investigation is ongoing.

Police responded to a domestic dispute and were able to assist in calming the situation. No charges were laid.

Police received a report of two young females stealing two carts full of drinks and snacks from the Sports arena. Police recovered the carts outside the Sports Arena but they were empty. If anyone has any information as to the identity of these girls please call the Weyburn Police Service or crime stoppers.

April 23rd

While on patrol a member of the Weyburn Police Service Traffic Services CTSS stopped a vehicle in the parking lot of a local drinking establishment. The driver displayed signs of impairment and was arrested. During the subsequent investigation the male subject refused a breath demand and was later charged with impaired and refusal to take the breath test. He was released from custody and will appear in court at a later date.

In the early morning hours Police responded to a domestic dispute on the east side of the city, Police were able to mediate the situation and helped separate those involved by giving one of the parties a ride to another address to spend the night.

Police received a report that a male had threatened to physically harm another person. During the investigation the suspect was located and arrested. He was subsequently found to have breached two conditions from a previous criminal charge. The accused was remanded in custody for court in Weyburn on April 26.

Police have received a number of complaints of mischief where parked vehicles have been damaged by what appears to be by a key. We are asking for the public's help in identifying the suspect or suspects or if you see anything suspicious please call the Weyburn Police Service.
