Weyburn Police Service Media Release December 13 to December 20, 2015

December 14th – Members of the Weyburn Police Service attended to a two vehicle motor vehicle accident at the intersection of 16th Street and Douglas Road after one vehicle had slid through the intersection striking a semi trailer. There were no injuries but the one vehicle needed to be towed from the scene. The driver, a 17 year old male was charged with driving too fast for road conditions.

December 15th – Police attended to a residence after receiving a 911 call regarding a domestic assault in progress. Police separated those involved and gave one party a ride to another location for the evening. The assault allegations continue to be investigated.

December 16th – A Member of the Weyburn Police Service while conducting roadside vehicle checks stopped a vehicle and found the driver displaying signs of intoxication. The driver failed a roadside test and was subsequently arrested and transported to the police station. As a result of the investigation the driver, a 23 year old female was charged with drive while over .08. She was released from custody to appear in court at a later date.

December 16th – While on patrol a member of the Weyburn Police Service found a male who was extremely intoxicated causing a disturbance in the downtown area. The male was subsequently arrested and lodged in cells for his safety. He was released when sober.

December 17th – While conducting roadside checks a member of the Weyburn Police service found a driver who was displaying signs of impairment. As a result of the investigation the driver, a 26 year old male, was issued a three day drivers license suspension.

December 17th – Police received a report of a fraud after a local resident received a cheque in a Christmas card. The victim then received phone calls asking if they had cashed the cheque. The victim did not cash the cheque and it was later determined it was fraud related after another individual had been instructed to send a cheque to Weyburn so they could claim a lottery win. No money was lost in this fraud, and members of the public are reminded not to cash cheques and then send money to individuals they do not know. If in doubt please contact your local police department.

December 17th – While on patrol a member of the Weyburn Police Service conducted a traffic stop and found the driver to be exhibiting signs of impairment. The driver a 35 year old male was arrested and the investigation resulted in the male being charged with impaired drive and drive while over .08. He was later released and will appear in court at a later date.

December 18th – Police received a call of a domestic assault; the subsequent investigation resulted in charges being laid against both involved, a 33 year old male and a 27 year old female. The individuals were released with conditions and will appear in court on a later date.

December 19th – While on patrol a member of the Weyburn Police Service observed a vehicle being driven in an erratic manner. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was found to be impaired. The investigation resulted in the 23 year old female driver being charged with impaired drive and drive vehicle with a blood alcohol level over .08. The accused was released and will appear in court at a later date.

December 19th – Police attended to a two vehicle motor vehicle accident on the 500 block of Elgin after a vehicle hit a parked car. The subsequent investigation resulted in the 17 year old female driver being charged with drive without due care.

During the past week Police have also received numerous complaints of vehicles parked in handicap parking spots. Drivers are reminded to not park in these spots without a valid permit being displayed. Individuals caught parking in a handicap stall may receive a fine of \$120.00. Please be courteous to those in need of these parking spots so they do not have to park further from an entrance and have to maneuver through snow and ice.
