December 21st

The Weyburn PS were called to a report of a shoplifter at a local business. The suspect was known to store staff and the theft was caught on store video surveillance. The matter is still under investigation but charges are expected to be laid.

At about 9:25 pm the Weyburn PS were made aware of a suspected impaired driver entering the City from a rural area. The vehicle was subsequently located and a 23 year old male was arrested and charged with Driving Over .08. He will be making a Court appearance in the near future.

December 23rd

The Weyburn PS responded to a report of a single vehicle collision involving a power pole. There were no injuries, but SaskPower had to be notified due to the damage on the pole. The matter is still under investigation.

The Weyburn PS were called upon regarding a neighbourhood dispute. As a result of the investigation a 47 year old female was warned of her actions.

The Weyburn PS received a report of a break & enter to a residence. As the result of the investigation the matter was not as serious as first thought. A 35 year old male has been charged with Break & Enter and Commit Mischief.

As the result of a traffic check a vehicle being driven by a 51 year old male was checked and the driver found to be under the influence of alcohol. The driver was issued a 3 day driving suspension.

December 26th

The Weyburn PS received a report of a 62 year old male that was missing in his travels. He was thought to be travelling to Weyburn for the holidays but had not arrived and his whereabouts unknown. The person was from Calgary and the assistance of the Calgary Police Service was requested. Before much could be done in the investigation the family was contacted by the person who had changed his holiday plans and did not notify anyone.

As the result of a traffic stop the Weyburn PS found a 44 year old male to be driving under the influence of alcohol. He was issued a 3 day driving suspension.

At about 9:00pm the Weyburn PS received a report of a person possibly in distress in a vehicle. Upon attending the location Members discovered a 31 year old male to be highly intoxicated and passed out in the vehicle. He was arrested and subsequently charged with having the Care & Control of a motor vehicle while impaired.
