January 18th

The Weyburn PS received a report involving a hit & run vehicle collision in the 100 block of 3RD Street NE. Thanks to the efforts of a witness the vehicle and driver were located and dealt with. This is a reminder to everyone that U-Turns are not permitted mid-block on any street and was a contributing cause to this incident.

January 19th

The Weyburn PS responded to a report of a hit & run vehicle collision having happened in the 10 Block of 4th Street NE between 2-3pm. Anyone having information on this incident is asked to contact either the Weyburn PS or Crime Stoppers.

The Weyburn PS received a report that some property listed on Kijiji was the subject of a potential Fraud. While at this point the owner did not appear to have suffered any loss we urge everyone to be diligent in their use of such commercial sites for the listing of real estate.
