January 4th

The Weyburn PS are investigating a report of the theft of a trailer. This appears to be related to an ongoing domestic issue.

January 5th

At about 5:14 am the Weyburn PS received a report of a suspicious vehicle. The vehicle was located and the driver identified. As a result of the stop a 63 year old male from Alberta was arrested for being in possession of a vehicle that had been stolen in Alberta some time ago. He is being held in custody in Regina and is facing charges both in Weyburn and in Alberta.
