January 26th

At about 4:45 pm The Weyburn PS received a report of what can best be described as a road rage incident where a vehicle received minor damage. The matter is still under investigation.

While on patrol a Member of the Weyburn Police Service observed a 41 year old male individual who he believed was wanted on an outstanding arrest Warrant. The Warrant was confirmed and the male arrested. He was later released to appear on Court on the outstanding matters.
