Media Release April 10, 2016 to April 17, 2016

April 11th

The Weyburn PS responded to a 2-vehicle collision on Bison Avenue and 2nd St NE. Investigation revealed that the vehicle travelling east on Bison Avenue and failed to stop for the Stop sign at 2nd Street colliding with a northbound vehicle. There were no injuries but both vehicle had to be towed from the scene.

April 12th

At about 4:35 pm the Weyburn PS responded to a disturbance at an apartment building. The 3 occupants became involved in a property disagreement. Police were able to mediate the matter.

The Weyburn PS has received more than one complaint this week involving what is often referred to as the 'Grandparent Scam'. In this scam a person receives a phone call from someone stating they are a family member who is in trouble and requires money for either legal or medical expenses. The scammer is very skilled in asking questions that will give them the next question making it look very much like they are who they claim to be. We urge people getting calls to be absolutely certain of the identity of someone before sending any money.

The Weyburn PS are investigating a report of a cheque fraud where the same cheque appears to have been cashed twice.

April 13th

The Weyburn PS received a complaint of mischief being done to a vehicle that was parked in the 1200 Block of Coteau Avenue where it appears the vehicle may have been keyed. Anyone with information on this is asked to contact the Weyburn PS, or to call Crime Stoppers.

The Weyburn PS were called to a domestic dispute at about 8:15 pm between a 49 year old male and a 50 year old female. Police were able to mediate the matter. Alcohol was a contributing factor.

The Weyburn PS received a report of a bicycle that had been stolen from the Comp School Lot. The bike is described as; Black BMX style with chrome handlebars and forks with red rims. Anyone knowing the whereabouts of this bike is asked to contact the Weyburn PS.

April 14th

At about 1:30 pm the Weyburn PS were called to an altercation with 3 people. As a result of the call and the investigation police have charged;

- A 19 year old male with Assault with a Weapon and with Assault Causing Bodily Harm
- A 24 year old male with; Possession of a prohibited weapon, and 2 counts of Assault Causing Bodily Harm
- A 21 year old female with 1 charge of Assault with a Weapon and 1 charge of Assault Causing Bodily Harm

All 3 were known to each other and this is believed to be an isolated incident.

At about 11:00pm the Weyburn PS conducted a traffic stop in the downtown core. As a result a 26 year old Moose Jaw resident has been charged with Driving Over .08.

April 17th

While on routine patrol at about 2:10 am the Weyburn PS noted a dark coloured SUV, believed to possibly be a Jeep Grand Cherokee, driving erratically. The police were unable to get the vehicle to stop. The vehicle was being driven in such a manner that some parts came off the vehicle.
