December 27

At about 10:30 pm the Weyburn PS responded to a report of a break & enter in progress in the 100 Block of 11th Street. As police were arriving at the residence the suspect fled in a vehicle and was pursued a very short distance to where he became stuck in some snow. The 43 year old male driver was arrested without incident and is now facing charges of: Mischief, Flight From Police, Refusing to take a Breath Test, Possession of Cocaine and Marihuana and Breach of an Undertaking. Police had earlier dealt with this male over a domestic issue. The accused was Remanded in Custody.

December 28

The Weyburn PS are investigating a complaint of a Hit & Run vehicle collision occurring in the 100 Block of 4th Street. A witness was able to provide a plate number of the offending vehicle and the matter is under active investigation.

December 30

The Weyburn PS was called to assist a 30 year old female in retrieving personal property from her former residence. The assistance was given with no issues arising.

January 1

The Weyburn PS received information that a 35 year old male had been assaulted by a 56 year old male. The victim had been located by the RCMP and taken to hospital where he later left against medical advice. The matter is still under investigation.

While on patrol at one of the bars Weyburn PS Members witnessed a minor altercation between 2 patrons. Police were able to intervene before the matter got out of hand and assisted each person in getting home safely.

At about 1:30am the Weyburn PS conducted a traffic stop in the 300 Block of Railway Avenue. As the result of the stop the 22 year old male driver was issued a ticket for Driving While Suspended and his vehicle was impounded for 30 days.
