PRESS RELEASE FOR NOVEMBER 28, 2016 TO DECEMBER 4, 2016

It was a very quiet week for the police regarding newsworthy calls.

November 29

At about 5:30 pm the Weyburn PS received a report regarding a vehicle colliding with a tree on Saskatchewan Drive. The investigation revealed that the 17 year old male driver thought he was too close to a guardrail and when he moved away the vehicle spun out of control striking a tree. There were no injuries.

Early in the morning of November 29th the Fillmore RCMP were called to a vehicle collision. As a result of that investigation the Weyburn PS were contacted to attempt to locate the vehicle driver and proceed with a drinking & driving investigation. The 38 year old male driver was subsequently located and has been charged with Driving Over .08.

December 2

At about 11:40 pm the Weyburn PS was called to a report of a disturbance at a local pub. The 34 year old male patron had left the business before police arrival.

December 3

The Weyburn PS was dispatched to a report of a theft of a cell phone. The investigation revealed that the matter was more of a dispute between friends. The cell phone was recovered with no further police action being taken.

We are urging anyone using the river to be particularly careful and make sure the ice is thick enough before you venture on. With the very mild temperatures the ice may not be well formed, and now with a covering of snow even with colder temperatures expected will take extra time to freeze to a safe thickness.
