Media Release for September 11, 2017 – September 16, 2017

September 11

The Weyburn PS received a call regarding a domestic dispute between involving a 44 year old female. Upon attending the matter was mediated without further need for police intervention.

September 12

The Weyburn PS received a report of a collision regarding a semi trailer unit hauling hay and a light post. The matter has been referred to SGI.

The Weyburn PS received a complaint regarding a significant credit card fraud. The matter is still under investigation.

At about 7:33 pm the Weyburn PS received reports of four 7 year old children who were missing and had not returned home. The boys were soon discovered near their homes in a wooded area of the City. This should underscore the importance of keeping track of your minor children at all times. The recent tragic and horrific events of last week in other areas of the Province should underscore just how quickly things can happen that are beyond anyone's control.

September 13

The Weyburn PS received a report of an adult female having been sexually assaulted. The investigation has concluded and as a result a 59 year old area male has been charged with 1 count of sexual assault. Both the victim and the accused were known to each other. There is no public safety concern. The male will be making a future court appearance.

The Weyburn PS dealt with a 53 year old female throughout the day. At one point the female was taken into custody pursuant to the Mental Health Act and was being treated at the hospital.

The Weyburn PS received a report of a vehicle having been stolen from within the City. The vehicle has subsequently been recovered in Moose Jaw. Anyone having information about this incident is asked to contact either the Weyburn Police Service, or to call Crime Stoppers at 1-0800-222-8477.

At about 3:25 pm the Weyburn PS received a call regarding a possible breach of Probation Order. As a result a 55 year old male was arrested and has been charged with Breach of Probation.

The Weyburn PS received a few complaints about thefts of property from unlocked vehicles. The solution is quite simple – lock your vehicle.

While on patrol, a vehicle stop was conducted resulting in a 28 year old male being charged with Driving while his Licence was Suspended.

September 14

While on patrol a Member of the Weyburn PS CTSS Unit received a 'hit' from the ALPR regarding a possible suspended driver. A traffic stop was conducted and as a result a 22 year old male was charged with Driving while Suspended.

At about 10:40 pm the Weyburn PS received a report of a vehicle having collided with private property. The investigation determined that the 17 year old driver of the vehicle was driving without Due Care & Attention and was issued a ticket for that offence.

September 16

The Weyburn PS is investigating a significant internal fraud involving a local business. The matter is still under investigation.
