Media Release for September 18, 2017 – October 7, 2017

September 18

The Weyburn PS is investigating a report of someone being unlawfully in a dwelling. Just before midnight an unknown person unlawfully entered a residence in the 700 Block of Bison avenue while the people were at home. The suspect is described as; Male, early 20's, 5'5" tall, wearing a dark t-shirt with white paint on it. Anyone having information that would assist in identifying this individual is asked to contact either the Weyburn PS, or to call Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477

September 19

While on patrol the Weyburn PS came across a very recent Break & Enter at the Signal Hill Arts Centre. Anyone having information about this incident is asked to contact either the Weyburn PS, or to call Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477

September 21

The Weyburn PS received a report of a domestic dispute in progress. Upon attending the police found a 29 year old male and a 26 year old female. The matter was mediated and the male agreed to find alternate lodging for the night.

The Weyburn PS is investigating a pair of related domestic assaults that happened about 6pm. Alcohol was a contributing factor. The investigation is continuing and charges have not yet been laid.

September 22

The Weyburn PS received a report of a person having taken a vehicle without the owner's consent. The vehicle was later recovered in the Melville, Sask area. The matter is still under investigation.

September 25

The Weyburn PS received a report of erratic driving that was captured on the video surveillance of the business. Charges under the Traffic Safety Act are pending against a 22 year old male.

The Weyburn PS was contacted regarding a teen youth wishing to move from her residence. Through the investigation an assault was alleged to have occurred. The matter is still under investigation.

September 26

The Weyburn PS received a complaint from a business of a teen youth who was believed to have shoplifted some merchandise. Upon review of the surveillance footage a teen youth has been identified as a suspect. The investigation is ongoing.

September 27

At about 2:15 am the Weyburn PS was dispatched to a residence regarding a domestic dispute that resulted in each person assaulting the other. The matter was mediated without further need for police involvement.

At about 3:10 am the Weyburn PS received a call of what appeared to be a 19 year old male passed out on a downtown street. Upon attending it was discovered that an intoxicated individual had been riding a bicycle when he lost control falling off. He was treated by EMS with non-life threatening injuries.

The Weyburn PS received a report of a 26 year old male having threatened family members. The male was eventually located and has been charged with Uttering Threats and will be making a court appearance.

September 29

At about 2:30 am the Weyburn PS received complaints about youth tipping over garbage cans. The responsible group of youth were located and warned. They were compliant in going back and picking up the garbage that had spilled out of the cans.

At about 3:55 am the Weyburn PS received a call of a possible domestic dispute in progress. It was found that a 24 year old female and 25 year old male had a disagreement. The matter was mediated with no further need for police involvement. Alcohol was a contributing factor.

The Weyburn PS received numerous complaints from the Dieppe Drive area regarding vehicle windshield wipers having been ripped from various vehicles in the area. Anyone having information about this incident is asked to contact either the Weyburn PS, or to call Crime Stoppers at -1800-222-8477.

The Weyburn PS received a report from a School Crossing Guard of a vehicle that disobeyed the directions of the Crossing Guard. We wish to remind all drivers that it is an offence to disobey a School Crossing Guard. If the vehicle can be identified charges will be laid.

October 1

The Weyburn PS received a call from a medical facility in Regina regarding a teen youth who was believed to be in Weyburn and who was threatening self harm. The youth was located and arrangements made with family members to assist him in returning to Regina.

The Weyburn PS received a report of a missing 24 year old female. The female was eventually located.

The Weyburn Police Service received a report of a parked vehicle being entered and items stolen. No suspects have been identified.

October 2

The Weyburn Police Service received a 9-1-1 call reporting an assault in progress. Police attended to the address to find the accused had fled the scene. The investigation determined a 30 year old female had been assaulted. The accused a 37 year old male was later arrested and charged with assault and breach. The victim did not suffer any injuries. The accused was remanded in custody for court.

The Weyburn Police Service received a report of an unlocked parked vehicle being entered overnight and a small amount of money stolen. No suspects have been identified. The incident remains under investigation.

The Weyburn Police Service received a report of a two vehicle motor vehicle accident at the intersection of 5th Street NE and Douglas Avenue. The one driver was charged with Proceeding from Stop sign before safe to do so. No injuries were reported in the accident.

October 3

The Weyburn Police Service received a report from a 24 year old female of a sexual assault that had occurred on October 1st involving a person who was known to the victim. The subsequent investigation resulted in a 37 year old male being arrested on October 4^t. The accused was charged with sexual

assault, unlawful confinement, trafficking and Breach of a Recognizance. The accused appeared in Estevan court on October 5th and was remanded in custody.

The Weyburn Police Service attended to a residence in the 300 Block of 3rd Street SE after receiving a call that a vehicle had driven into a fence and then left the scene. The investigation into this incident is ongoing.

October 4

The Weyburn Police Service received a call of an intoxicated individual walking on the street. Police located a 27 year old male who was arrested and lodged in cells for their safety. The individual was later released with no charges.

October 5

The Weyburn Police Service was notified of a 69 year old female who was disoriented and had wandered away from family. Police and family members searched the area until receiving a call from a member of the public of a female who appeared lost. The female was then located unharmed and returned to the care of family members.

October 6

A member of the Weyburn Police Service conducted a vehicle stop for speeding and found the driver, a 35 year old male, to be exhibiting signs of impairment by alcohol. The subsequent investigation resulted in the driver being arrested for impaired and transported to cells. The accused was charged with impaired drive, drive while over .08 and Breach of Probation. The accused was later released from custody and will appear in court in November.

The Weyburn Police Service was called after a report of a large piece of farm equipment that was being transported had hit a railway crossing sign and a light standard in the City. Police located the driver, who had pulled over when safe to do so to call and report the accident. No charges were laid.

October 7

While on patrol a member of the Weyburn Police Service conducted a vehicle stop and found the driver, a 68 year old male to be impaired by alcohol. The accused was arrested and the investigation resulted in the accused being charged with impaired drive and drive while over .08. The accused was later released from custody and will appear in Court in November.

Over the course of the last few weeks there have been a number of CRA and other scam calls again. We continue to urge people to not provide any type of personal information over the phone unless you verify who you are talking to. No Government agency uses overt threats and intimidation tactics to scare you into compliance.

We also had a number of calls again where vehicles were rummaged through and items stolen. This simply cannot happen if you lock your vehicle. In Weyburn we have absolutely no experience with someone breaking a vehicle window to gain entry simply to steal items. If the vehicle is locked, they simply move onto the next easy target of opportunity. The easy availability of unlocked vehicles brings the criminal element to your neighbourhood right outside of your homes. Help us keep Weyburn safe by being proactive and locking your vehicles!
