Media Release for February 20, 2018 – March 4, 2018

February 20

At about 10:35 pm the Weyburn PS were dispatched to a residence regarding an adult female who was attempting self-harm. It was also learned that the female had been involved in a domestic assault earlier in the evening. She was transported to the Weyburn General Hospital for assessment and has also been charged with assault offences.

February 21

The Weyburn PS were called to deal with an unruly patient at a health care facility. As a result, the adult female was arrested and has been charged with Uttering Threats.

February 23

The Weyburn PS received a complaint regarding a potential fraud from an internet sales site. The person was diligent and had not suffered any loss. This once again underscores the importance of being careful about any transactions on-line.

At about 10:20 pm the Weyburn PS conducted a traffic stop on a speeding vehicle. As the result of that stop a 36 year old female was arrested and has been charged with Driving over .08. Her license has been suspended indefinitely and her vehicle was impounded.

February 25

The Weyburn PS received numerous complaints of vehicles having been rummaged through and garages having been entered in the central area of the City. The matter is still under investigation and we have identified some persons of interest in this matter.

At about 10:15 pm the Weyburn PS conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle being driven by a 50 year old male. As a result of the stop the driver was issued a 21 day license suspension. The vehicle was impounded as well.

February 26

The Weyburn PS assisted with a youth who was suffering from suspected illicit drug issues.

And yet again we received numerous calls on various telephone and internet scams. As always – please be vigilant with who you do business with.

February 26

Weyburn PS Members responded to a call in the downtown core of a person apparently in distress. A male was located and found to be highly intoxicated. He was taken home to the care of family members.

February 27

A Weyburn PS Member conducted a traffic stop of a driver believed to be Suspended for medical reasons. The suspension was confirmed and the driver charged accordingly.

February 28

The Weyburn PS received a call of a domestic disturbance issue. The police attended and assisted one of the spouses to leave the residence.

March 1

The Weyburn PS conducted a curfew compliance check on an adult female who is on curfew conditions. The person was not home and charges have been laid for Breach of Release Conditions.

March 3

The Weyburn PS received a call regarding a female who was threatening self-harm. The female had left the residence prior to police arrival but was located and found to be suffering from self-inflicted non-life threatening injuries and was transported to the Weyburn General Hospital.

The Weyburn PS received 2 calls regarding unlocked vehicles having been rummaged through. This occurred in the 300 Block of 3rd Street and the 100 Block of 8th Street.

March 4

At about 8:30 am the Weyburn PS received a call regarding a single vehicle traffic collision in the downtown core and that the female driver was in medical distress. Police, EMS and Fire attended the scene and located a semi-conscious 23 year old female driver and lone occupant. The female was transported to the Weyburn General Hospital and then to Regina. The matter is still under investigation and the possibility of charges are being pursued.
